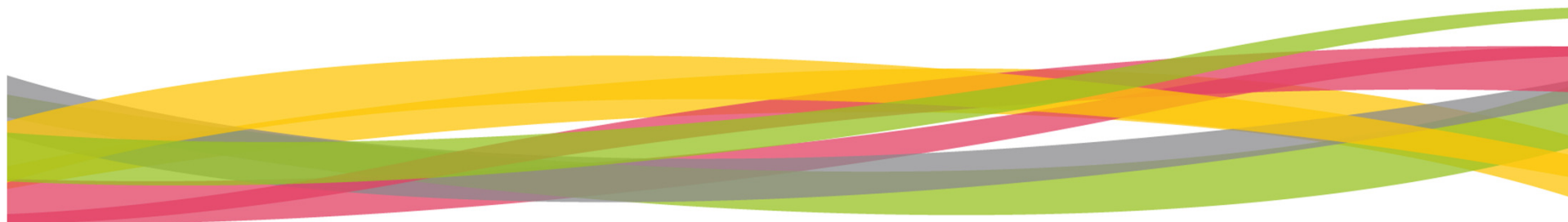

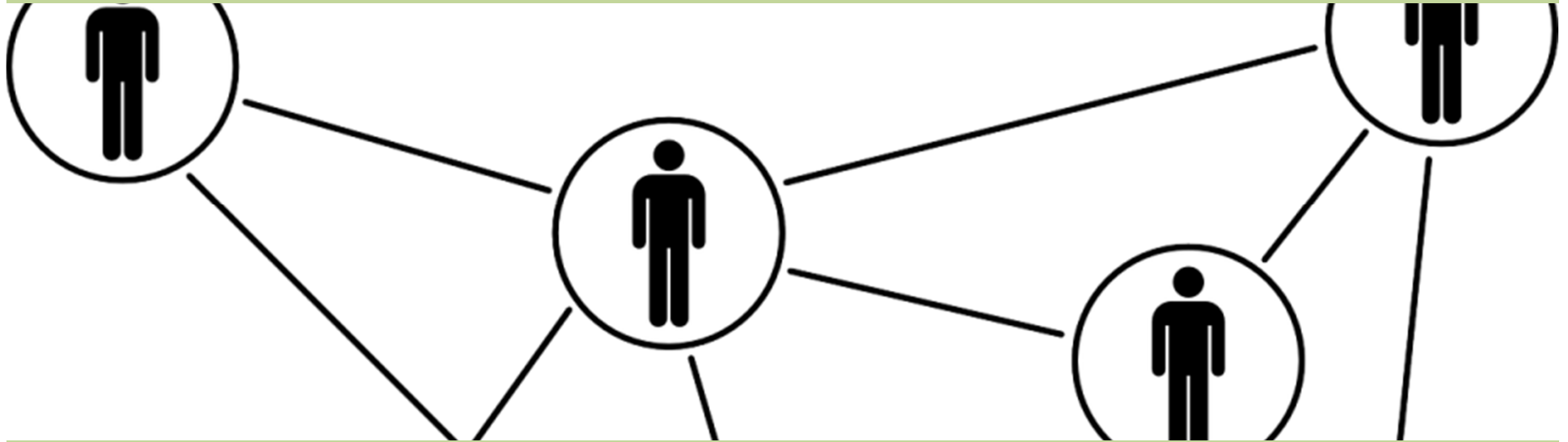

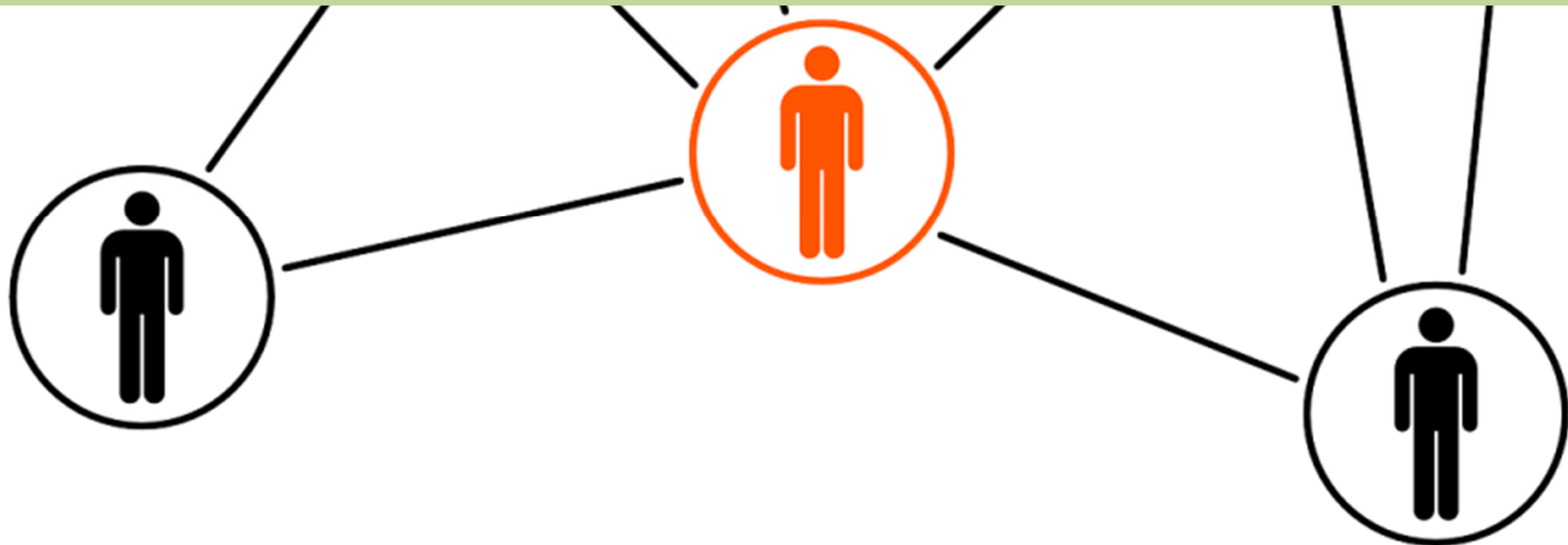

In IVB we had two calls for smaller projects from which 15 projects were approved.

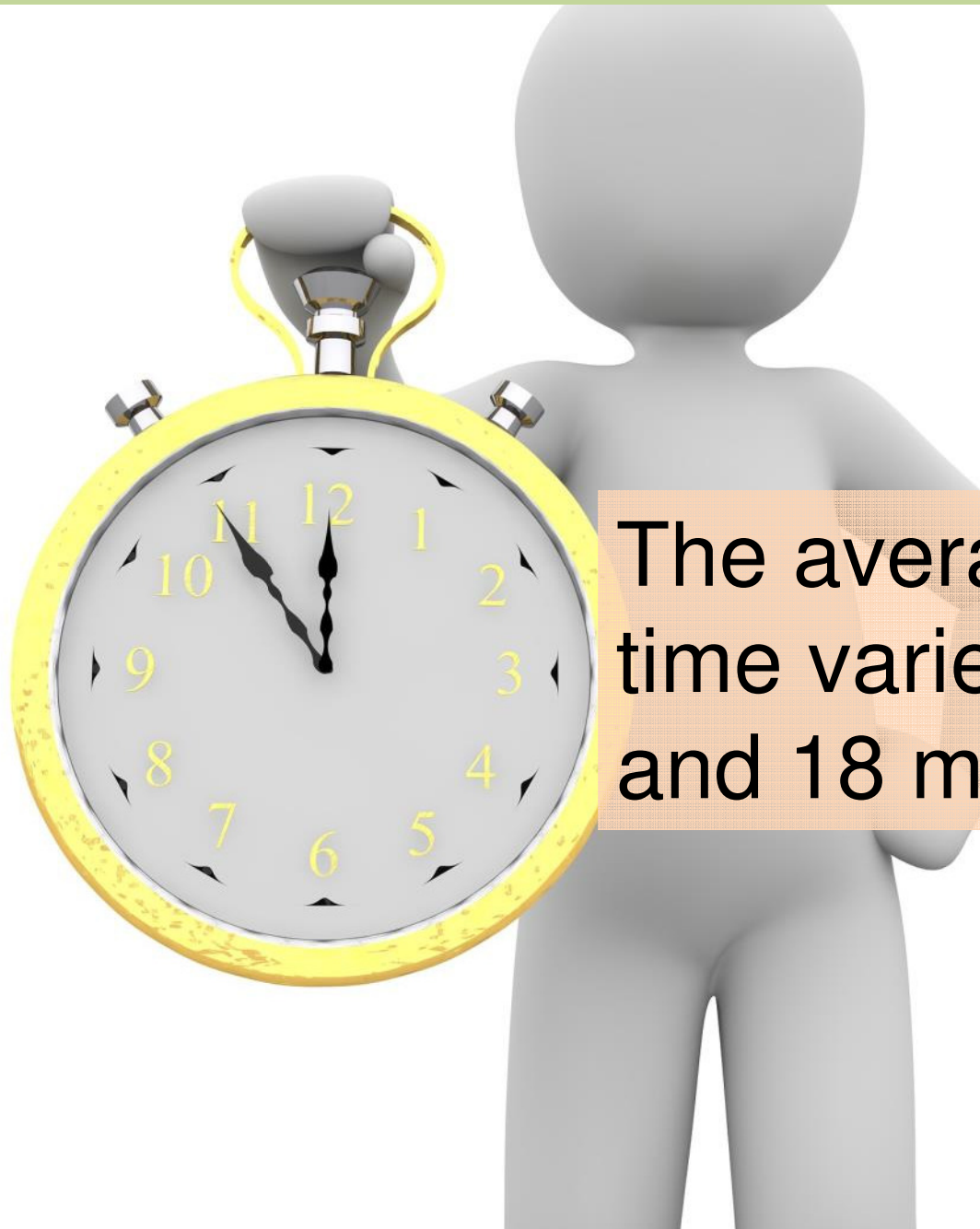
PARTNERS

DURATION



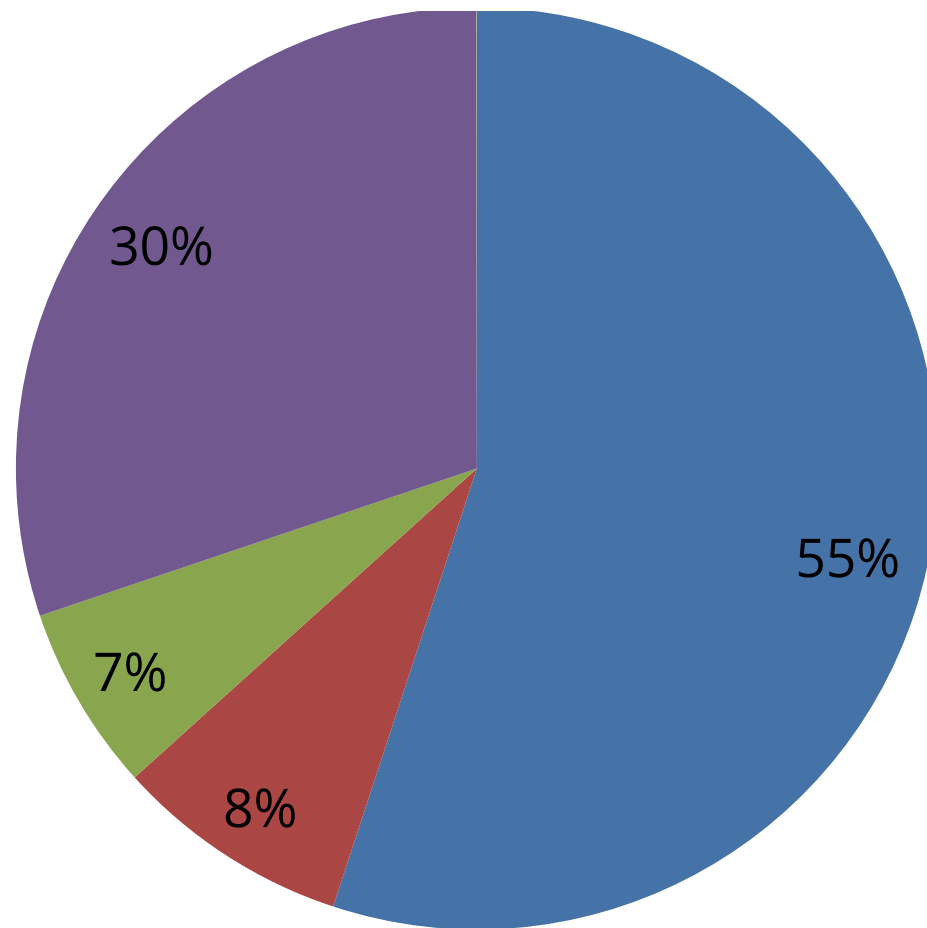
The average duration time varied between 12 and 18 months

- Investments



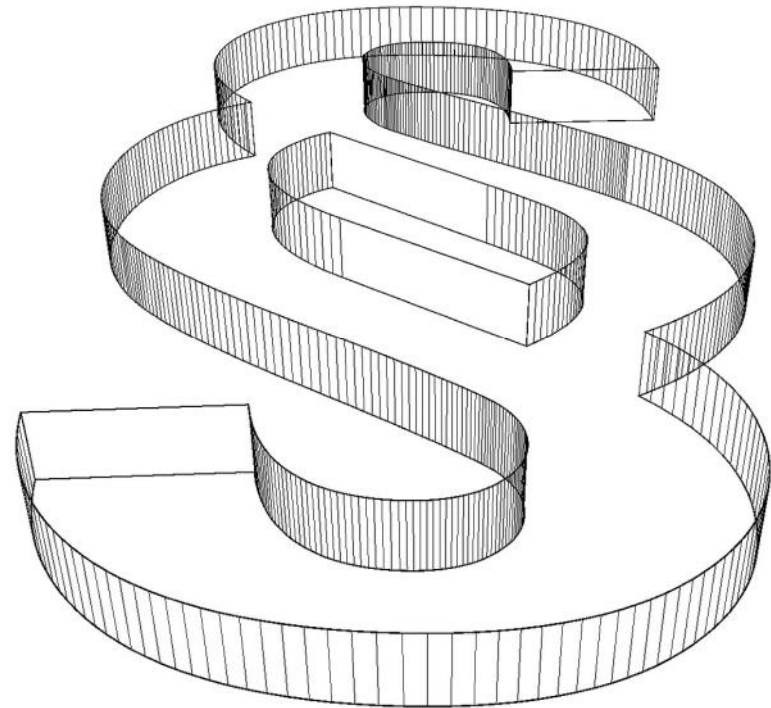

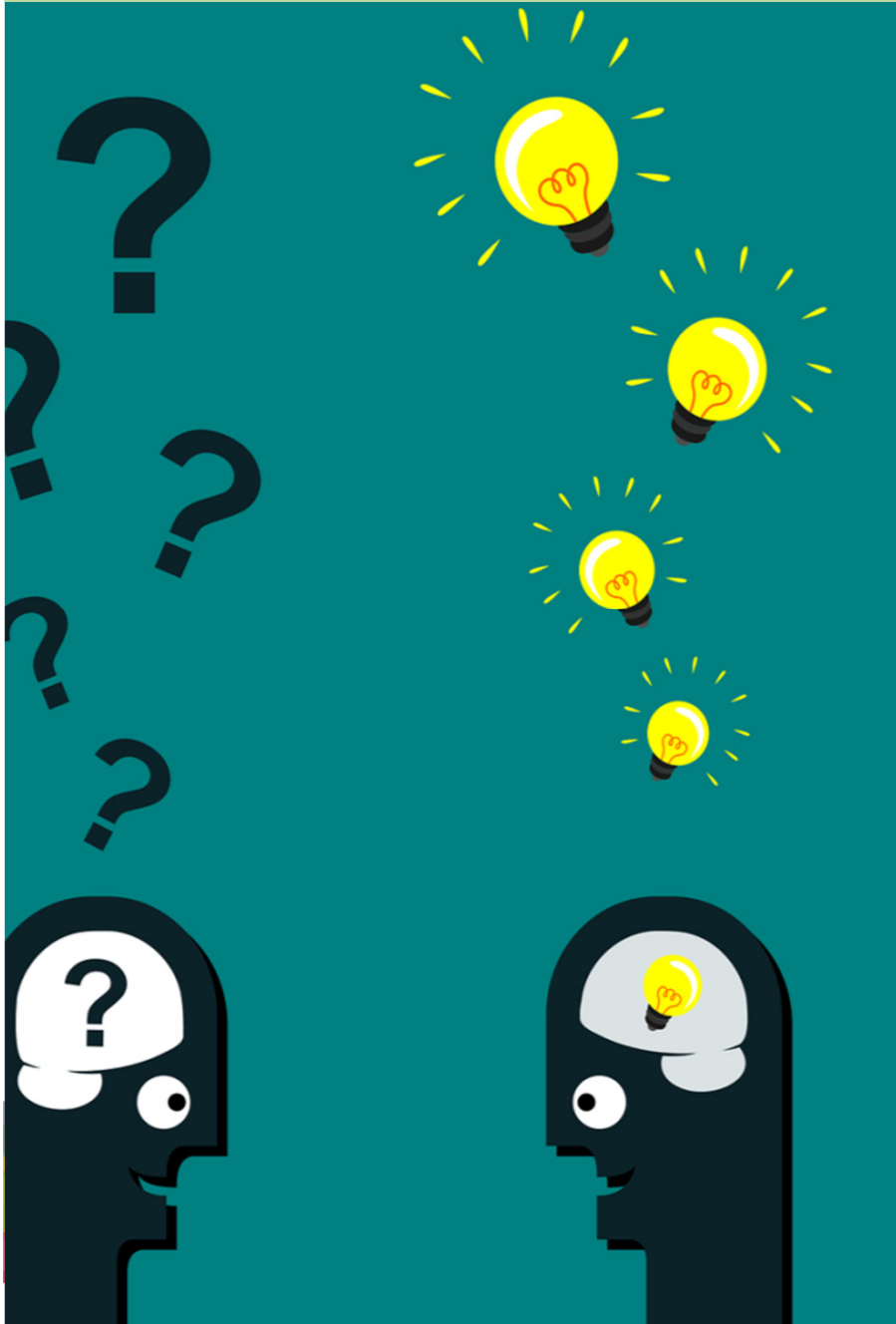
POSSIBLE FRAMEWORK

- Lead beneficiary is a beneficiary from an existing project
- Limited project duration time (less than three years)
- As easy to operate as possible
- Limited focus on control
