DUAL Ports went to EMD2019 in Portugal

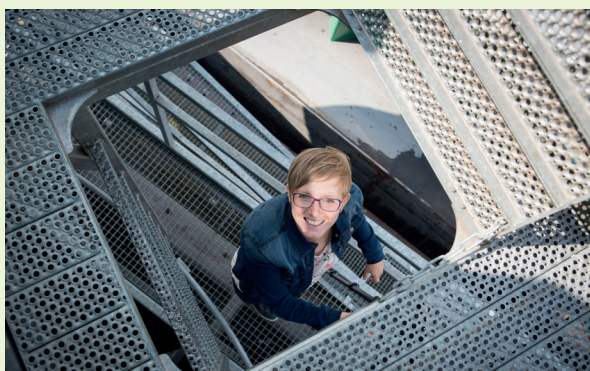
